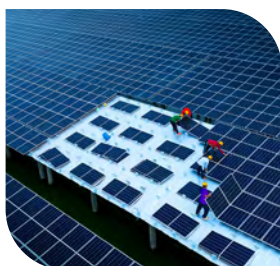
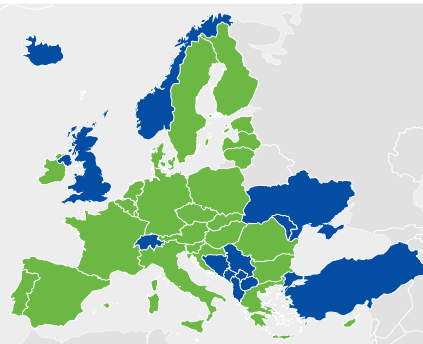


Key Findings from the 2025 EIT Impact Study

The European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT) is the EU's largest innovation ecosystem, connecting education, research, and business to turn ideas into products, develop talent, and help companies grow, thereby strengthening Europe's competitiveness and helping to close the skills and innovation gap.

The EIT connects more than 2 200 diverse partners – innovative companies, universities, research organisations and cities among them – to drive innovation and create a strong financial and economic multiplier effect, helping startups attract significant amounts of external investment, while its KICs mobilise partners and resources to build sustainable innovation ecosystems.
